"Having a baby, changes everything around us"

Remember when you had your first baby or knew a friend who did? It's a crazy experience. Your life changes dramatically when you become a parent. Your home soon fills with baby items, it's everywhere! Even a simple errand that might take just 5 to 10 minutes requires lengthy preparation; loading the car with essentials takes an additional 10 to 15 minutes, not to mention bundling up the baby for the trip. Having a baby truly changes everything in your world, much like the Christmas season does.

The calendar on the wall tells us it is December (or at least it will be by the time you receive this newsletter). In the same way, the church calendar reminds us that we are entering the season of Advent. Both calendars signal that it's time to prepare.

December prompts us to get ready for Christmas: cleaning the house for guests, facing the crowds of holiday shoppers, wrapping presents, baking cookies, decorating the tree, attending parties, and hanging stockings with care.

However, the Advent to-do list is quite different from the pre-Christmas one. Rather than rushing around madly, the Advent season invites us to take time to wonder and anticipate with great joy the incredible event yet to come. Instead of cleaning our homes, the Advent to-do list asks us to cleanse our hearts and minds in preparation for the birth of the Christ child, whose arrival changes everything.

And indeed, Jesus' birth transforms everything. When my firstborn arrived, I described becoming a parent as flipping a light switch on inside me. It was a light I had never known was there, and once it was on, I couldn't imagine life without it. This feeling echoes the opening verses of John's gospel: "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it." The light that entered the world through Christ's birth shines brightly for all to see and changes everything.

At His birth, Jesus brought the light of God's love, truth, mercy, compassion, and forgiveness into the world. This light offers hope and courage to those who see it, reminding us that we are not alone on this journey. It encourages us to become light-bearers ourselves, sharing God's love and compassion in tangible ways—such as donating to food pantries, forgiving those who have hurt us, volunteering at homeless shelters, advocating for the vulnerable, and much more.

Now that this light has entered our world, it's hard to imagine a time without it. A baby truly can change everything. A baby can flip your world upside down and introduce you to a depth of love you never knew existed. Indeed, a baby boy named Jesus, born in a stable so long ago, can do all of this and so much more for you, for me, and for all the world.



Church Council Minutes October 9, 2024

Called to order at 8:00 AM
Devotions led by Matt Anderson.
Motion to approve previous minutes with corrections:
Motioned by Janet Ewalt, Motioned 2nd by Josh Krage. Motion Carried.

Motion:

Instruct Steve Donney to; facilitate and move money between our various Funds and accounts in sufficient amounts to fund the "expected distributions for 2025. Generally, from the "at risk" investments to "safer" MM or fixed annuity accounts. And, Steve will, on a best-effort basis, depending on the difficulty of accomplishing this, either move most or all of the MIF (ELCA) money to either Thrivent or Vanguard MMs readjust the Thrivent annuity allocations.

Vickey Motioned, Stephánie 2nd. Motion carried.

This reason for moving the Legacy's ELCA MIF funds is even at our \$80,000+ balance they are crediting 1.25% currently. This compares to approx. 4.5% in the MMs. Right now, around \$40,792 will be distributed from the Endowment Fund which is 5% of earnings that can be distributed in January. This number could change by the end of the year.

By moving the funds, it will keep those funds gained in a safer, less risky account. Our total Assets in our Accounts as of 9/30/2024 was \$1,361,991.43.

Financial Report:

In September, expenses exceed revenues by \$5,538.59. For the year we are short \$2,686.51. Weekly giving is up compared to the past two years. Motion to approve by Stephaine, seconded by Janet.

Reviewed committee minutes.

Janet motioned to approve committee minutes, 2nd Vicky Motion carried.

Motion to continue with 2025 Gold+ plan for Pastor Kurt. Motioned by Josh, 2nd by Owen. Motion carried.
