Worship & Music & Arts Meets once a month. Summer months and holiday breaks may change meeting dates and times. *Church Constitution:* The Worship and Music and Arts Committee shall coordinate resources and enrich the worship life of this congregation.

Children and Family Ministry Committee Meets as needed. *Church Constitution:* The Children and Family Ministry Committee shall conduct general planning and oversight of the learning ministries of he congregation in accordance with Confession of Faith and the Statement of Purpose of the constitution of this Congregation.

Property meets when needed. *Church Constitution:* The Property Committee shall care for all property and furnishings of the congregation and shall make an annual inspection to a certain and immediate and long term needs for adequate maintenance and prudent improvement of such property.

Adult and Family Ministry Committee Meets as needed. *Church Constitution:* The Adult and Family Ministry Committee shall communicate the Statement of Purpose set forth in C4.01-C4.03 of the Constitution of this congregation and shall endeavor to involve each member of this congregation in faithful support of such purpose. This includes discipleship, evangelism, pastoral care, prayer, fellowship. Christian nurture, and similar ministries.




