

Adjusted Bank Balance is \$23,698.23 Giving is up over almost every month from last year.

3. Old Business

Update on lightning strike repairs.

We're still waiting on parts for the fire suppression system. We are still waiting on a part for the video system. Pastor is calling every week.

One of the tvs is out from the lightning strike. Pastor suggests that we wait until Black Friday deals to replace it. Dave said he has one that he would give to the church and Scott might have one as well. Pastor is still working with the insurance company and documenting damage. It's unlikely that we will reach the \$10,000 deductible.

4. New Business

Main computer and Website

Our main computer's processing speed is slowing down. It will be upgraded this week. It will cost \$170 for the part and \$120 for the service call. We are close to switching to Google emails. We have obtained all of the licences. It will not change our email address. This will free up more data on our website.

Pastor reached out to a different website company called Envision in Winona to create a new website for the church. Pastor is getting more information and will bring it to the council at a later date.

There is SPAM mail that appears to be coming from the Pastor but check the email address to make sure it is from the Pastor. He will not email you for gift card money! The Pastor is in talks with copier companies because our lease is expiring with our current company to find the best deal and fit for the church.
